BRISCOE WESTERN ART MUSEUM'S 2025 NIGHT OF ARTISTS ACHIEVES \$2 MILLION IN ART SALES

Annual Exhibition and Sale Continue through May 11

San Antonio, TX – (April 2025) The Briscoe Western Art Museum proudly announces the overwhelming success of its <u>2025 Night of Artists Exhibition and Sale</u>, which generated \$2 million in art sales thus far, with total event proceeds reaching more than \$2.92 million through sponsorships, ticket sales and art purchases. As one of the premier Western art events in the nation, *Night of Artists* once again proved to be a mustattend celebration of Western heritage, culture and artistic excellence.

Collectors and art enthusiasts from across the country gathered for a dynamic opening weekend, where spirited bidding led to some remarkable sales. The top live auction lot, Bonnie Marris' "The Best Stick Ever," ignited an intense bidding war before selling for an impressive \$103,500 hammer price including buyer's premium. Other notable auction sales included John Coleman's "Of Heaven and Earth" and Don Oelze's "On the Edge of the World" and Jim Vogel's "A Bird in the Hand," all of which sold far above estimates.

"This year's Night of Artists showcased the incredible talent and vision of today's top Western artists, and we are thrilled by the enthusiastic response from collectors and guests," said Liz Jackson, President and CEO of the Briscoe Western Art Museum. "The energy, excitement, and record-breaking sales reinforce the importance of preserving and celebrating Western art. We are grateful to our artists, patrons and supporters for making this event such a success."

One of largest Western art exhibitions and sales of its kind, the museum's signature fundraiser and exhibition draws artists, collectors and enthusiasts to the Briscoe each year. Opening festivities welcomed more than 1,700 guests, who enjoyed the event's new Small Works Sale, which saw an incredible 85% of works sold, as well as the engaging Luck of the Draw Sale. Through opening weekend alone, the event secured 66% of available artwork sold, a number expected to grow as the exhibition and sale remain open for additional purchases through May 11. More than 270 works from 85 artists are included in the exhibition and sale.

The "Cowboy Bob" Museum Purchase Award recognizes a work chosen to be added to the Briscoe's permanent collection. At the conclusion of the *Night of Artists* exhibition, Dustin Payne's "What Man Can Conceive," will be added to the Briscoe's permanent collection.

The "Best Body of Work" award is a new recognition category. The Sam Houston, James Bowie and Alamo Awards represent "Best in Show" recognition, chosen by the *Night of Artists* Art Selection Committee, an anonymous panel of Western art collectors who are deeply involved with the museum. The David Crockett and William B. Travis awards are selected by fellow artists and show patrons respectively.

This year's exhibition and sale welcomes an <u>extraordinary lineup</u> of returning favorites and exciting new voices in Western art.
